

Guidelines for publication

As it was announced, the organizing committee will coordinate the publication of a conference volume. Below are the guidelines and deadlines for participation in this project.

GUIDELINES

- Only fully developed papers will be accepted, presentations and extended abstracts are not eligible.
- Full papers have to contain the discussion of the topic in an academic context, including scientific background (literature), methods (if applicable), research findings and conclusions.
- The maximum length of papers is 8,000 words (including references, tables etc.). There is no minimum length.
- The submitted work must be in reasonably good English. The publisher will provide English editing, but limited only to grammar and spelling. No one can expect the language editor to handle substantive/scientific issues. It is the responsibility of the author to provide an English narrative acceptable for publication.

DEADLINES

- Authors have to notify the organizing committee about **their intention to be part of this volume by September 30, 2013**. This has to be done via the conference website. Nothing needs to be submitted at this time.
- Authors will need to submit their **completed work by January 15, 2014**. Submission guidelines (format, software etc.) will be available on the conference website.
- These deadlines are final and non-extendable.

It is important to note that submitting your work to this project would not make it ineligible for submissions elsewhere (such as to the Eastern European Countryside). However, multiple submissions cannot be identical. If you plan to do this, please make sure to have different discussions of the same general topic.
